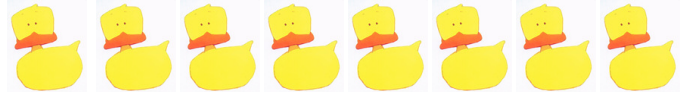
### Snoqualmie Drama Department Presents

**HELPFUL STEPS TO FOLLOW:** Pick a topic or problem to investigate. Begin your research & start a journal. Write your hypothesis. Collect or buy materials for your display. Continue to record observations in your journal. Type explanations and background information and mount your display. Design signs, labels, charts, graphs, or other visuals for your display. Take any photographs needed & have the film developed. Write & proofread final version of your report.
